# NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Whenever I sit down to begin envisioning a production, I always ask myself "Why this play NOW?" and with Botticelli in the Fire it could not have been more obvious. Jordan Tannahill's masterpiece premiered in 2018, yet as a 2022 audience experiencing plagues, attacks on LGBTQIA+ rights, and a Chicago Theater renaissance of sorts, I think you'll find this queer fantasia lens of 15th century Florence strangely familiar.

During 2020, we peeled hack the floorboards of the American Theater to reveal our problematic and exclusionary history. A "reckoning" was called for, brought to light by the We See You White American Theatre documents. Theaters across the country made performative statements acknowledging past harm and vowed how they would change going forward. In 2021 we started producing again and slowly realized that nothing had actually changed. As one of the wrongfully terminated 9 staff members of Victory Gardens (The VGT 9), I was so excited by the change that Ken-Matt Martin and Roxanna attempting Conner were instill. vet they were failed bv the white supremacist capitalist non-profit structure in conjunction with a toxic, overreaching

Board of Directors who were not willing to make the real change that was necessary. This is not the renaissance we called for in 2020. We have to ask ourselves and collectively decide what we truly want Chicago theater to be going forward.

This is a play about artists who imagine a world of iov. connection, pleasure and mutual aid-and their vision of the world we could live in is soundly rejected by a fearful populace. As a queer and trans person watching more than 300 anti-LGBTQ (mostly anti-trans youth) bills introduced across the country in the last couple years, it has been both exhausting and terrifying to live in America where freedom is only meant for Christian, white, cisgender, able-bodied, males. In this time and in all times, it's of paramount importance to support queer joy wherever we find it. On the first day of rehearsal, I asked each actor how their characters are either embracing queer joy or stifling queer joy throughout the play. I would ask the same question to all of you. In this time of plague and possibility, how can you empower queer joy?

#### **JORDAN TANNAHILL**

(Playwright; He/Him) is a Canadian writer and director. He has been described as being 'widely celebrated as one of Canada's most accomplished young playwrights, filmmakers and all-around multidisciplinary artists' (Toronto Star), and 'the enfant terrible of Canadian theatre' (Libération). His plays have been translated into ten languages and widely honored

in Canada and abroad. He has twice received a Governor General's Literary Award - in 2014 for Age of Minority: Three Solo Plays, and in 2018 for his plays Botticelli in the Fire and Sunday in Sodom. His plays, performance texts and productions have been presented at venues including The Young Vic Theatre (London), Sadler's Wells (London), The Kitchen (NYC), Festival d'Avignon (Avignon), The Lincoln Centre (NYC), The Deutsches Theater (Berlin), The Volkstheater (Vienna), The National Arts Centre of Canada (Ottawa), Woolly Mammoth Theatre (Washington, D.C.) and on London's West End. He is the author of *Theatre of the Unimpressed*, a book of essays on theatre. His debut novel Liminal, a work of autofiction, was named one of the best Canadian novels of 2018 by CBC Books and won France's 2021 Prix des Jeunes Libraires. His second novel, The Listeners, has just been published by HarperCollins. His virtual reality performance Draw Me Close, produced by the National Theatre (UK) and the National Film Board of Canada, was presented at the Tribeca Film Festival and Venice Biennale in 2017, and ran at London's Young Vic Theatre in January 2019. Jordan has also worked in dance, choreographing and performing with Christopher House in Marienbad for the Toronto Dance Theatre, and writing the text for Akram Khan's dance pieces Xenos and Outwitting the Devil, both currently touring internationally. From 2012 - 2016, in collaboration with William Ellis, Jordan ran the alternative art space Videofag out of their home in Toronto's Kensington Market neighbourhood. Over the four years of its operation, Videofag became an influential hub for queer and avant-garde work in Canada.
